

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR BOOK OR EXHIBITION REVIEWS CANADIAN JOURNAL OF IRISH STUDIES

Many thanks for agreeing to write a review for *The Canadian Journal of Irish Studies*.

Below you will find some guidelines for the review. Please be advised that we would not want you to write the review if you have a relationship with any of the authors/curators/administrators that would complicate the independence of your evaluation.

- Date due: approximately three months from receipt of book or completion of exhibition visit (please notify the review editor who assigned the book upon receipt, if it was to be mailed to you).
- Recommended length: 500-1000 words
- Please submit the completed review by email to the editor who assigned it to you, as a Word file.

Be sure to include the following information at the start of your review, laid out as follows:

- For a book review:

Author(s) or editor(s) full names

Book title in full, in Italics

City: Publisher, year of publication. Number of pages. ISBN number. Price.

Reviewed by [Your Name]

[The name of your institution should be included at the end of the review]

for example:

Ruth Barton, *Acting Irish in Hollywood: From Fitzgerald to Farrell*. Dublin: Irish Academic Press, 2006. 251 pages. ISBN: 9780716533436 (cloth), 9780716533443 (paper). USD \$75.00 / \$29.50.

Please avoid using footnotes in a book review. For quotations from the book being reviewed, please indicate the page in parentheses following the quote. If in doubt, use the Book Reviews section of the most recent issue of the journal as a guide.

- For an exhibition review:

Name of Exhibition in italics

Institution

Venue (if not at the primary location of the institution)

Exhibition team

Duration

Exhibition Website

Please assume that the reader might not have attended the exhibition, hence it is necessary to provide a brief description of it, of the intentions of the curator(s), and an assessment of the degree to which it reflects those intentions. Images of the exhibition are encouraged (please see the Submission Guidelines for *CJIS* for further information with regard to images).
